**All Batteries MUST have their terminals taped or placed in individual plastic bags

Rechargeable



Power Tools, Laptops, Phones and other electronic equipment, etc. Also, some look like alkalines, check labels to determine if they are rechargeable.

Look for Lithium, NiCD, NiMH, Rechargeable

Alkaline



Come in many different shapes and sizes. Many typical household batteries you would use in a remote control, radio, toy, smoke detector, etc. are alkalines. (AA, AAA, C, D, 6V, 9V, etc) Some alkaline batteries look a lot like rechargeables (including lithium-ions) and the only way to tell the difference is to read the label.

Button/Coin



Small, flat, circular batteries often found in hearing aids, watches, calculators, etc
