

Enjoy learning about TPH and what it does for you.





Al has worked for the Tioga County Public Health Department since 2006. He started as a Public Health Technician and within two years was promoted to Sanitarian. His interest in and commitment to public health is evident in him getting his Master's degree in Public Health and in becoming a Certified Lead Assessor. Al positively impacts our families who need help and guidance in home safety. He is also instrumental in assuring that our restaurants, summer camps and public pools are safe. Al exemplifies what public health is all about.

Adam Ace:

Adam started working for Tioga County Public Health as a PH Technician on August 13, 2012. Adam keeps track of all the septic systems being constructed in the county. He learned the GIS mapping system that is now used for multiple areas in public health, which allows for quick recognition of potential Public Health problem areas to be addressed. Adam currently is the Healthy Neighborhoods Coordinator. He shows much knowledge and care for the families of Tioga County. While at a home, he recognized the family was in a very dangerous situation that involved carbon monoxide. He was able to get the family out of the home to safety and call for assistance, and through it all remained calm. Adam took the initiative to improve internal forms for the department which can be auto-loaded into databases, preventing entry errors. There are many other responsibilities Adam oversees. If there is a job that seems impossible, Adam is the person who can do it.

2017 Public Health Highlights:



- Over 2,000 children under age ten were served by public health programs: Early Intervention, Children with Special Health Care Needs, Traffic Safety, Mobile Dental Services and the Fluoride Varnish Program
- We are the first health department in the state to have online registration for rabies vaccination clinics
- Free flu vaccines offered to Tioga County residents who had difficulty paying
- Upgraded information systems and technology devices within the department
- Lyme Disease prevention initiative included educating over 150 children in schools on the tick-borne illness and distributing over 1,500 tick removal kits to the community
- Met with several providers to assist in increasing vaccine and lead testing rates
- Built a successful partnership between the Healthy Neighborhoods Program and Tioga Opportunities Housing to complete 119 safety checks
- Secured funding to purchase a new mobile dental unit




Lyme Disease Rate 2013-15






2014 Binge Drinking Rates

Public Health Preparedness

Tioga County Public Health is responsible for protecting the health of our community. To do this we train and prepare for the next unknown threat to the community. Anything from a disease outbreak to water contamination puts the community's health at risk. We also educate residents about the importance of planning for sheltering-in-place, communications and evacuation.



Lyme Disease in Tioga County

Lyme disease continues to be a growing issue in Tioga County. In 2017 there were 42 confirmed cases of Lyme disease, with many more that went unreported due to the difficulty of diagnosing Lyme disease. Lyme disease comes from a bacteria that is transmitted from the bite of a deer tick. Symptoms are similar to the flu. but often come with a bull's-eye rash. When spending time outdoors during the late spring and summer months, make sure to keep you and your family protected from the big disease from a little bug!



Outreach and Education

To better educate the public about the growing numbers of Lyme disease in Tioga County, tick removal kits were given out at rabies clinics, outreach events, and at the front desk of the Public Health clinic. These kits included: educational material, tick identification cards, instructions on how to remove a tick, and even a pair of tweezers! Lyme disease education was also taught to 3rd and 4th graders at Owego-Apalachin Elementary before a summer spent outdoors!



Rabies

Tioga County Public Health holds several Rabies Vaccination Clinics around the county each year. This was the first year that individuals could preregister electronically for the rabies clinics, which helped get everyone through the clinic faster. Tioga County was the first health department in New York State to have online registration for their rabies clinics! A huge thank you goes out to our staff and local veterinarians from across the county who make these clinics possible!

Child Passenger Safety



Thank you to all of our CPS Technicians who continue to make our program successful along with the Tioga County Sheriff's Office, Waverly Police Department and Owego Police Department!








Early Intervention: A program for children birth - 3 years old who may have a developmental delay, disability, or condition that affects their development. Services are provided to help your child grow and develop, and for parents to help support and promote their child's development and growth.


Children with Special Health Care Needs: Informational program for children birth - 21 years old who have a serious physical, behavioral, or emotional condition or delay requiring special health related services.

The Opioid Epidemic

The opioid epidemic continues to get attention at the local, state, and national level. In the past few years, opioid related deaths have surpassed deaths from car crashes, gun violence, and HIV/AIDS. Opioids are killing over 2,500 people every three weeks; that is equivalent to having 9/11 occur every three weeks. Tioga County Public Health, along with numerous other stakeholders in Tioga County, continue to bring awareness to this epidemic. Additional funding from the state has been brought into this region to combat the growing number of opioid addictions and overdoses that are being recorded.

Tioga County Public Health has worked with Trinity-CASA, the lead agency working on substance abuse issues in the county. Throughout the past year there have been several events held across the county including a family fun day event that included Narcan trainings, bounce houses, guest speakers, a memorial vigil and more. We are active participants on the Allies in Substance Abuse Prevention (ASAP) Coalition and continue to help in the fight against this epidemic.

Narcan

Narcan (also known as Naloxone) is a medication used to reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. Tioga County Public Health provides law enforcement with Narcan and has it available for anyone from the public who would like to be trained to use it. Rural communities, like Tioga County, can benefit more from having Narcan available in homes because of the long response time of first responders.


Public Health Nursing

2017 was another successful year for the Tioga Mobile Dental Program. Adults and children visited the Tioga Dental Van and received services including dental cleanings, sealants, fillings and extractions.

The Fluoride Varnish Program was just as busy applying protective fluoride varnish applications at elementary and Head Start classrooms. Twice a year, participating children receive a fluoride varnish application and a new toothbrush. This program provided over 1,000 fluoride varnish applications to Tioga County children!

Tioga Mobile Dental Van served the community at various sites including all the school districts and the Owego Countryside Community Center.

RICHFORD SMILES!

Thanks to a Care Compass Network Award, we were able to organize Richford Smiles. This event was held at the Richford Community Center. Agencies from Tioga and Broome Counties provided information about available resources. Participants received free backpack lunches for children, Stoughton Farm gift cards, free dental services, and hygiene kits.

Richford Smiles was a great opportunity for people to access resources and dental care that are typically limited or non-existent in the area. One participant shared, "This was the first time in many years that I've had my teeth cleaned."





In December of 2017, Tioga County Public Health was awarded a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$300,000 to be used toward the purchase of a new mobile dental vehicle. With additional funds from the Appalachian Regional Commission and Floyd Hooker Foundation, We are able to purchase a new mobile dental unit in 2018!

Healthy Neighborhoods Program

Our 4th year proved to be our most successful since the program began back in 2013. This program offers free home health and safety checks to all Tioga County residents with no income requirements. These checks identify problems related to fire prevention, mold, lead poisoning, indoor air quality, injury prevention, safe drinking water, pests, and more! Individuals who participate in the program receive free resources and items to respond to their specific needs. We work with numerous agencies throughout the county to help reach clients who can benefit from this program, or who have a serious health and safety risk occurring in their home.

Teaming Up with Tioga Opportunities:

In July 2017, Tioga County Public Health teamed up with Tioga Opportunities Housing to complete 119 Healthy Neighborhoods Visits! These visits were completed during the apartments' annual inspections. Environmental Health went in to the senior living apartments and did safety checks on things like tripping hazards, working smoke detectors, and indoor air quality for those with asthma. Residents were given a goody bag filled with new cleaning supplies, non-slip shower mats, a water bottle, and a Tioga County Resource Guide. The partnership between the Healthy Neighborhoods Program and Tioga Opportunities Housing is one that we hope to continue for years to come!



Elevated Levels of Radon in Tioga County

In August 2017 a report from New York State showed that Tioga County was among the five counties with the highest rates of radon across the entire state, with about 54% of the homes in our county having elevated levels of radon. Radon is an invisible gas that is produced by the natural decay of uranium and is found in nearly all soils. This gas can get into your home through the foundation and cause serious health risks for those living in the home. Exposure over a long period of time increases one's risk of developing lung cancer; in fact radon is the leading cause of lung cancer related deaths in nonsmokers. After a press release to multiple media sources, there was an influx of calls to us. We were able to do free radon testing in 124 homes across the county! We encourage radon testing in the home so families who are exposed to elevated levels of radon are aware of it and are able to address the issue.


